

FAHS - High School Course Selection 2022-2023 School Year

In January, parents/guardians of eighth grade students will be mailed information about the High School Course Selection event that will occur on Monday, February 5th from 3:30-5:30 p.m. and again on Thursday, February 8th from 4:00-7:00 p.m. It is essential that students and their parents/guardians complete the Course Selection process on one of these dates. Katie Utphall, high school counselor, will be meeting with the 8th grade students on January 24th and 25th at the middle school to assist them in preparing for Course Selection. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Ms. Utphall at the high school at 563-7811 ext. 1145. Students who do not complete the Course Selection process will have courses selected for them by their high school counselors.

All eighth graders and parents of eighth graders are asked to attend a "Freshman Orientation to the Course Selection Process" presentation to be held in the high school auditorium prior to going to the gymnasium for Course Selection. This presentation is about 15 minutes long and will go over key information about the Course Selection process, required courses, planning for future careers/college, and how many credits to schedule in a year.

Presentations will be held at the following times: Monday, February 5th 3:40pm and 4:30pm Thursday, February 8th 4:15pm and 5:30pm, Spanish Presentation at 5:45pm

When families arrive at the event, they will receive a folder of all the course selection materials necessary for the event. Students should bring their school-issued Chromebook. Tables will be set up in the Commons for parents and students who need a place to sit to discuss their choices and identify questions for teachers. The high school counselors will also be available in the Commons to answer any questions and assist families with the process. When students are ready to finalize their course selections, they will proceed into the gymnasium where teachers are organized at tables by department. Students can ask questions about courses and get signatures for enrollment in a course at the department tables. Parent/guardian signatures are required to complete the course selection process. If you are not able to attend one of the two events, please call the High School Pupil Services Office (920-563-7811 ext. 1143) to make other arrangements.

The course description booklet, referred to as the Program of Studies, for the 2025-2025 school year will be posted online for families to access beginning in mid-December on the Fort Atkinson High School's website. 8th graders will also be given a copy of the Program of Studies when Ms. Utphall visits them at the middle school in January. 
International Travel - 2025

In the Classroom . . .



Grade 6

<u>Math</u> Keep an open mind this month and practice growth mindset! Ask your students to explain what it means to divide and visually show you how to divide fractions with a tape diagram. Make sure you check out the <u>Illustrative Math website</u>, you can find helpful math hints and videos for homework help.

<u>Science</u> We are continuing to learn about thermal energy through investigating our regular and fancy cups. Ask your student about the differences between warmer and colder particles.

This month the **Social Studies** students will be learning about the Ancient Greeks. This unit will cover how geography, representative government & democracy, literature, arts, philosophy, science, math, medicine and engineering created a unique culture in ancient Greece. A conversation starter could include comparing culture and government between ancient Greece and the United States.

<u>English/Language Arts</u> What is your student reading for their LDG? Students will discuss their books in groups the rest of December! We will also be working on our revising and editing skills in our argumentative essays and have our classroom spelling bees prior to winter break!

Grade 7

In <u>Language Arts</u>, we will wrap up our poetry unit with ode presentations.

Students will then view and create Public Service Announcements about causes and issues to which they are loyal. Students will also be reading LDG novels; ask your child about the LDG novel they are reading and expect to see them reading this novel at home. (Due dates and assigned chapters will be on google classroom.)

7th grade <u>Math</u> students will be studying from Unit 4: Proportional Relationships and Percentages. In this unit, students use ratios, scale factors, unit rates (also called constants of proportionality), and proportional relationships to solve multi-step, real-world problems that involve fractions and percentages.

In <u>Science</u>, students will be exploring the Periodic Table of Elements! They will learn about atomic structure and even practice drawing atomic models.

<u>Social Studies</u> 7th Grade Social Studies students will be looking at the Western Expansion of the USA. With that, looking into the inventions and innovations that made life easier.

Grade 8

In <u>ELA</u> students are continuing their photo essays on a national or local alliance of their choice. They are also learning all about verbs, specifically the different types of voice and mood of a verb. Ask your student if they can tell you the five different types of verb moods.

Look out USA, the students of Fort are on their way! 8th grade <u>Social Studies</u> students will learn about the economy, political structure and cultural aspects of the United States. Up next is our friendly neighbor to the North...Canada!

Students in <u>Math 8</u> will be finishing their studies of graphing and writing linear equations and before winter break, will become experts in algebraically finding solutions to one variable equations.

In <u>Algebra</u> December begins with students analyzing categorical data and deciding how well linear models represent given data. By mid December we will begin our study of functions. On about December 15th, be sure to ask your student what a function is and how it's like a soda machine.

District Reminders



This school year has been in session for 62 days from Aug. 28th-Nov.30th.

How many of them have you attended?

School attendance is correlated with higher achievement and attendance is important in building strong academic skills, learning to manage emotions, and building friendships. The stoplight graphic shows the number of days that indicate positive attendance and attendance numbers that are a concern. Take a minute to check powerschool to see how your child's attendance has been.

If you have been at school 48 days or fewer-you have attended 79% or less of the school year.

You may find it difficult to learn, your grades may be lower than you would like and you may have more challenges with the work.

If you have been at school 49.5 days you have been at school 80% of the time or more

Missing this many days--you may find yourself falling behind your peers.

If you have been at school 55 days or more-you have 90% or higher attendance.

Attending school this much can help keep you on pace.

If you find your attendance at a red or yellow light--see what changes you can try in order to improve your attendance. If you have to be out for a health reason, be sure to communicate that so we can work on helping you still get the material—and work with your teachers.

We know that COVID, colds, influenza and other factors affect attendance--practicing general health and safety measures (washing your hands, covering your mouth when you cough, covering your nose when you sneeze, monitoring other symptoms and staying home when warranted) can help. Please take care of your health to keep others healthy. Remember that when students are healthy we believe it is important for them to be at school.

Si ha estado en la escuela 48 días o menos, ha asistido el 79% o menos del año escolar.

Puede que le resulte difícil aprender, sus calificaciones pueden ser más bajas de lo que le gustaría y es posible que tenga más desafíos con el trabajo.

Si has estado en la escuela 49,5 días has estado en la escuela el 80% del tiempo o más

Si te pierdes esto muchos días, es posible que te quedes atrás de tus compañeros.

Si ha estado en la escuela 55 días o más, tiene una asistencia del 90% o más.

Asistir tanto a la escuela puede ayudarte a mantener el ritmo.

Si encuentra su asistencia en un semáforo en rojo o amarillo, vea qué cambios puede intentar para mejorar su asistencia. Si tiene que estar ausente por motivos de salud, asegúrese de comunicarlo para que podamos trabajar para ayudarlo a obtener el material y trabajar con sus maestros.

Sabemos que el COVID, los resfriados, la influenza y otros factores afectan la asistencia: practicar medidas generales de salud y seguridad (lavarse las manos, cubrirse la boca al toser, cubrirse la nariz al estornudar, monitorear otros síntomas y quedarse en casa cuando sea necesario) puede ayuda.
