

AP: PROCESS AND TIMELINE FOR EXAM REGISTRATION

AP test registration is here! If your child is taking an AP class, it is time for them to sign up to take the AP exam in May.

AP teachers shared a <u>payment information form</u> with all AP students, and <u>this form</u> was also emailed home to all AP parents. Here are the relevant details:

 - 2 exams = \$196

AP: PROCESS CONTINUED..

- Due November 1, 2023
- Submit your payment through Powerschool/School Pay, or the main office at Fort Atkinson High School
- Checks may be made payable to FAHS (student name and "AP" in memo line)
- Multiple students and exams may be included in one check
- \$40 fee charged by College Board for late test registration. (\$138 per exam after deadline)
- Students taking (second semester-only classes) AP Microeconomics do not need to pay until February 1, but may pay for that exam now, if desired.
- If a child is on free or reduced lunch, they qualify for free AP exams. Please fill out this form (and turn in) to allow us to verify this information. [English] [Español]
- If your family is having financial difficulties and you may qualify for free or reduced lunch, please fill out this form to apply [Website], and this form so we can verify your status. [English] [Español]
- If your family is having short-term financial difficulties, please email AdvancedPlacement@fortschools.org to let us know. We will arrange an altered payment schedule with you.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO TAKE CHALLENGING CLASSES?

"College professors know the difference in their classes when they meet a student who has learned how to work hard, challenge assumptions, and think like a college student while in high school. Challenging, enriching course selection in high school makes a committed, interested student in college... Engaging in fast-paced learning now ensures a foundation for continued exploration at the college level." Leigh J.– Western Kentucky University

Common Misconceptions about College Entrance and Success:

MISCONCEPTION 1: I have a great GPA; I won't have any trouble getting into college.

Sorry, a good GPA is not enough. Colleges look closely at transcripts. They look to see if students took the most challenging classes offered. Colleges want students who will contribute to the intellectual environment in college, not just go with what is easy. Colleges look for applicants who will actively participate in and improve the campus community. When looking at extracurricular activities, they look for students who stick with and have leadership experience in those activities.

MISCONCEPTION 2: If I get a lower grade in an AP class, there goes my scholarship money.

Universities and many scholarship organizations are much more concerned that students were challenged and engaged in intellectual exploration than have a high GPA. Harvard Admissions says, "There is no single academic path we expect all students to follow, but the strongest applicants take the most rigorous secondary school curricula available to them. The Admissions Committee recognizes that schools vary by size, academic program, and grading policies, so we do not have rigid grade requirements. We do seek students who achieve at a high level; and most admitted students rank in the top 10-15% of their graduating classes." A

MISCONCEPTION 3: The University I want to go to won't accept AP credit.

Individual school websites show exactly how much credit a student can earn for specific AP exams. Most AP exams earn 3-5 college credits with some earning. Nationwide, more than 90% of colleges and universities accept AP credit.

MISCONCEPTION 4: I don't need to take honors classes prior to the AP class.

Honors classes prepare students for the advanced thinking required in an AP or college class. Every time students challenge themselves in an academic environment, they become more prepared for and more likely to succeed in future scholarly endeavors.

MISCONCEPTION 5: The AP tests are too expensive!

The tests seem expensive. Consider though, an AP test costs \$97 and can net a student 3 or more hours of college credit. The tuition savings at college can amount to literally thousands of dollars. AP also offers fee reduction for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch. At these rates, college-bound students can't afford *not* to take AP classes and tests.

MISCONCEPTION 6: AP won't help me once I get into college.

AP classes give students a chance to "take a college class for free." A rigorous AP class will help students learn time management and study planning. The AP test is much like a college final—in some classes a final can be 30-100% of the grade. Most importantly, AP classes teach students how to think and ask questions—essential skills for a university setting. These statistics can make it even clearer:

- Research shows that students who take AP courses are more likely than their peers to attend college and graduate on time.
- Of students who earned a 2 or higher on their AP Exam, they are 21% more likely than their academically similar peers to enroll in a four-year college.
- Students who earn an AP Exam score of 2 or higher do significantly better in their introductory college courses.
