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## What to Expect

Open the world of fashion from your own closet. Fashion Analysis focuses on the study of the fashion and garment industry with emphasis on the basics of design and construction. Students will develop a global view and weigh design decisions within the parameters of ecological, socio-economic, and cultural contents. Concepts are applied with hands-on learning experiences as students study career pathways, textiles, fashion design, apparel construction, consumer behavior, products, and materials of the fashion industry. Projects are integrated throughout the course work.
