All about EMPATHY

This school year will be all about building empathy at Barrie Elementary! But what is empathy? Some may confuse empathy and sympathy because they are closely related. Having sympathy is more about feeling sorry for someone or simply acknowledging the pain or suffering someone is going through. Empathy, on the other hand, goes deeper. It's about understanding and sharing in the feelings of others and requires a more heartfelt and compassionate response. Empathy fosters deeper connections and understanding of other's emotions.

Benefits of Building Empathy in Children



It helps children understand and relate to the emotions and experiences of others. This ability to connect with people on an emotional level is essential for building positive relationships, making friends, and resolving conflicts peacefully

They can understand the perspectives of others and find compromises or solutions that take everyone's feelings into account. This reduces aggression and promotes healthier interactions.







When children can empathize with the feelings of others, they are less likely to engage in hurtful actions or stand by silently when others are mistreated. Empathy promotes kindness and inclusivity.

When children learn to recognize and understand their own emotions, they become better at managing their feelings. This self-regulation is an essential life skill that contributes to emotional well-being.

Self-Awareness





It encourages children to listen actively and ask questions to better understand others. Effective communication is vital for healthy relationships and success in various aspects of life

Empathy encourages open-mindedness and a willingness to learn about diverse backgrounds and perspectives, promoting tolerance and reducing prejudice.


Cultural Sensitivity

News from the School Nurse





COVID-19 Isolation/Quarantine Protocols

Exposure to COVID-19

If no symptoms, may continue attending school/work.

Wear a face covering for 10 days when around others.

Monitor for symptoms and test if possible.

Stay home if symptoms develop



*If you are unable to wear a mask around others you must quarantine/isolate for the full exposure period of 10 days Isolate for 5 Days

If no symptoms or symptoms are resolving after 5 days and have not had a fever for 24 hours without the use of a fever-reducing medication, isolation can end.

If symptoms persist continue to stay home until resolving

Communicate with school symptoms are resolving to return

*Wear a face covering around others for 5 more days

Monitor your Child's Symptoms

COVID-19 Symptoms

or sent home from school

ONE of these symptoms:

- Fever (100.4° or greater) or chills
- · Cough new or worsening
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- · New loss of taste or smell
- · Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea

TWO or more of these symptoms:

- Sore Throat
- Fatigue
- Muscle/body aches
- Headache
- · Congestion or runny nose

Stay Home

Testing is recommended.

If no symptoms or symptoms are resolving after 3 days and have not had a fever for 24 hours without the use of a fever-reducing medication, the student may return to school

Communicate with school symptoms are resolving to return

September is Attendance awareness month:

Fort Atkinson families—thanks for making school attendance a priority to start off the school-year. A few things researchers have found about the impact of school attendance- specifically in the month of September—the pattern established in September tends to persist throughout the school year*.

For example-

Missing fewer than 2 days in September continued that pattern with students averaging fewer than 2 days every month throughout the year (or fewer than 10 days absent the whole year).

Students who missed more than 4 days in September increased absences over the school year and averaged missing about 6 to 9 days a month or over 70 days in the school year.

When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.

We recognize there are times when students are not able to attend because they are ill or showing symptoms of illness and it is best for them to stay home. If that is the case, please be sure to contact the attendance office. But as long as your child is healthy, we believe it is important for them to be at school.


