Educational Rights

Under the McKinney-Vento Act, children

(age 21 and younger) have the right to:

- Go to school, no matter where they live or how long they have lived there.
- Attend either the local school or the school of origin, if this is in their best interest. The school of origin is the school the child attended when he/she was permanently house or the school in which the child was last enrolled.
- Receive transportation to and from school of origin.
- Enroll in school immediately, even
 if missing records and documents
 normally required for enrollment
 such as a birth certificate, proof of
 residence, previous school records,
 or immunization/medical records.
- Enroll, attend classes, and participate fully in all school activities while the school arranges for the transfer of records.
- Have access to the same programs and services that are available to all other students including transportation and supplemental educational services and activities.
